Community-Based Tenant Initiative Fund

Program Objectives



Community-Based Tenant Initiative Fund

All proposals should help achieve at least **one** of these funding objectives:

- increase/ promote access to information
- build capacity around housing decisions and responsibilities
- increase participation in housing-related decisions and projects





Eligibility Requirements



Community-Based Tenant Initiative Fund

- Community organizations that work with tenants, tenant associations, community housing providers (non-profit, social housing or co-operative) or sector service providers
- The project must fall under both at least one funding objective and one priority area
- The project must be completed by 2024
- The amount requested cannot exceed \$150,000

Types of Activities Covered



Community-Based Tenant Initiative Fund

- Raising public awareness of tenant issues
- Providing information and awareness on tenant rights and responsibilities
- Advancing knowledge of improved housing options
- Improving financial literacy/ capacity related to housing
- Increasing meaningful tenant participation in and influence on housing decisions/ projects that affect them and in defining services
- Acknowledging and integrating Indigenous knowledge

Examples of Projects (CBTIF)



Community-Based Tenant Initiative Fund

- Conducting a pilot project to bring information around tenant rights from a local non-profit organization to vulnerable tenants
- Redefining selection policies for unit allocation to ensure equity amongst tenants
- Training for board members as to initiate tenant engagement and representation on the board

- Support sectoral consolidation and other partnerships

- Identify and fill sectoral gaps in housing services
- Engage community





Eligibility Requirements



Local Projects Stream

- Planned activities must demonstrate that they will benefit the local community itself (e.g.: provider(s), neighbourhood(s); etc.)
- Maximum funding amount of \$150,000.



Sector Impact Stream

- Demonstrated capacity to implement large projects with far-reaching impact;
- Planned activities must demonstrate a benefit to the community housing sector or benefit the communities themselves;
- There is **no maximum** amount of funding.





Types of Activities Covered

Sector Impact Stream

- New resources, knowledge, innovations and partnerships that can be scaled and replicated for better sectorial outcomes;
- Partnerships designed to increase the potential of qualitative impact on the community housing sector;
- Exploration of new business models
- Consolidation, cooperation, collaboration, mutualization, merger or partnership activities that enhance economies of scale, capacity and asset sharing and leveraging;
- Other transformative initiatives that align with STF funding objectives.





Types of Activities Covered

Sector Impact Stream

- Enhancement of **environmental sustainability** (better energy management practices, shared car program for tenants and staff, carbon footprint reduction, etc.);
- Development of services responding to identified gaps in local housing services;
- Community engagement activities towards housing projects;
- Relevant training for board members, managers or staff;
- Organizational or financial assessment;
- Development of management tools.

Sector Impact Stream

- Communication tools that increase sectoral awareness and improve environmental sustainability practices;
- New financial models to improve sector capacity to grow;
- Pilot projects and initiatives that **build sectoral capacity**;
- Development of monitoring tools and data collection;
- Development of a service answering to **identified gaps in services for a large area** or community;
- Development of tools that benefit the sector.

Disbursement and Reporting General Guidelines

The following provides a guideline on the reporting requirements and disbursement schedule according to the funding bracket and timeframe of the project. Please note that these are rough guidelines and slight adjustments may occur depending on the unique conditions and needs of each project.

We understand that milestones will shift and grow as projects do also. The Centre will adapt the disbursement and reporting schedule in order match changing needs.
