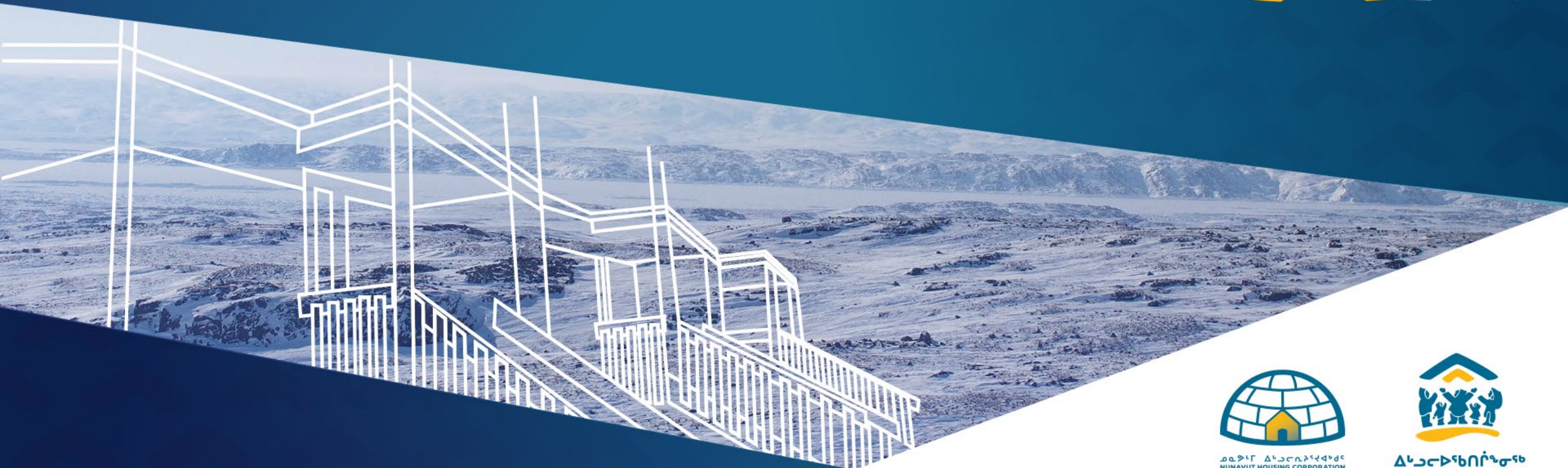

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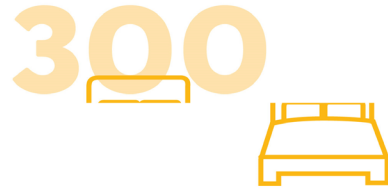
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# Nunavut Housing Continuum

delivered by Inuit for-profit organizations and companies with co-investment from the Nunavut Housing Corporation



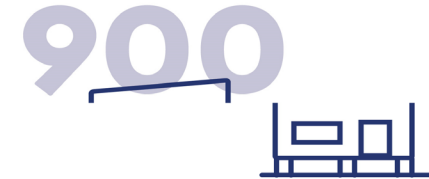
**300 transitional**

**housing units** delivered based on market demand and market financing with limited, if any, public investment



**1,400 public**

**housing units/beds** delivered by the Nunavut Housing Corporation or other government or community partners



**900 affordable**

**housing units** delivered through conventional procurement and partnerships agreements



**housing units** delivered primarily through organizations, no community organization or private sector contribution with Nunavut Housing Corporation



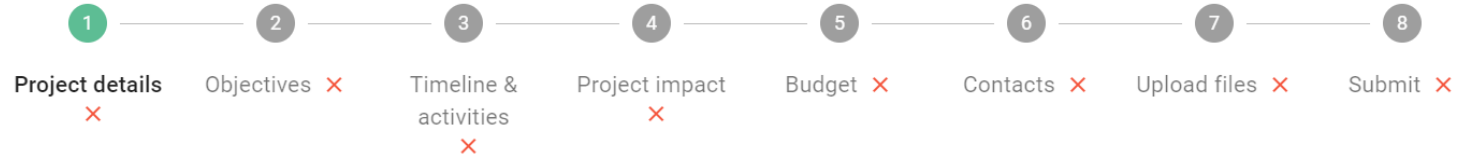
